- "Our results show a direct link between wetland drainage and peak streamflows during a flood"
- "By restricting wetland drainage in the future, or restoring wetlands, we could reduce infrastructure costs from floods, such as washed-out roads and flooded communities
- "This latest research confirms that wetlands effectively buffer hydrological extremes"
